### BBQ and Blues in Madison during Aug. 18-21, 2011

Historic Madison will be celebrating ten years of fabulous blues music and barbecue Aug. 19-20 when the Southern Indiana and Kentucky units will be having their joint rally at the Jefferson County Fairgrounds.

Ribberfest has evolved into one of Madison's major attractions and features the Indiana State Championship Barbecue Cook-Off, a kids barbecue competition, a Backyard Barbecue Blast and music by well known blues artists Friday evening and beginning at 11:30 on Saturday.

Ribberfest is just one of many attractions at the Joint Rally.

The Jefferson County Fairgrounds is an excellent facility for a rally with 30 amp electricity and water and a few 50 amp sites. It has a large meeting room with a kitchen.

The Rally will kick off with the Thursday evening dinner that will feature a Baked Potato Bar prepared by the Kentucky Unit. A representative from the Madison Convention and Visitors Bureau will make a presentation at 7 p.m. about what to do in Madison.

Friday will be Madison Day, devoted to exploring this unique and historic community.

Popular attractions in Madison include the Lanier Mansion, the Madison Railroad Station and Heritage
Center, the Sullivan House, Dr. Hutchings office, The Costigan House and Schroeder's Saddle Tree Factory.

The morning organized tours will be followed by free time for lunch at a local restaurant and time to explore the Downtown area. Downtown Madison has an abundance of unique and interesting shops. The evening dinner will be a Rally highlight, at the Clifty Falls State Park Inn, which features a bountiful buffet.

Saturday will kick off with a sausage and pancake breakfast prepared by the Kentucky Unit. The rest of the day will be set aside for people to visit Ribberfest or just relaxing around the rally site. Saturday evening will be a pitch-in dinner with the Southern Indiana Unit providing the meat.

### INSTALLATION RALLY OCTOBER 06 - 09, 2011

Plans are currently being made for our installation rally to be held at Pride Park in Taylor Mill, Kentucky. This 72 acre park located within minutes to all of the Northern Kentucky/Cincinnati attractions was once a local sheep farm. The park has restrooms, picnic shelters, walking paths an 18 hole frisbee golf course in addition to very scenic views of the rolling hills of Northern Kentucky.



This will be a back to basics rally with water available to fill your fresh water tanks and very limited electricity. There will be 15amp service for up to four units available to those with medical needs. Additionally we will have a 6500 watt Honda generator to charge batteries when needed.
